Minutes of the regular meeting of the Council of the City of Monongahela, Due notice of which meeting was published according to law, held Wednesday, July 11, 2018, at 7:00p.m., in Council Chambers. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Kepics who lead in the pledge to the flag.

Before the start of Public Forum, the Solicitor, Todd Pappasergi, reminded those speaking of the three (3) minute time limit.

Public Forum

Lee Mizwa, Mound & Ohio Streets, had pictures of His basement flooded, due to the recent heavy rains. He said eight other homes experienced flooding also. This was not from storm water, but from sewer water. He asked what the City planned to do to alleviate the problem, since this is a problem with the sewage pipe. He stated that this has been an on-going problem. The Mayor told Mr. Mizwa the City Engineers, along with Mark Gadd are currently reviewing these and other areas, where flooding is a problem.

Terry Necciai, 400 Meade Street, spoke about the Monongahela Main St. Program and reported a new business coming to 4th & Main, at the Yohe Building. A LuLaRue clothing warehouse will be going in there. It will be opened for scheduled parties, and special events. The Old Chamber of Commerce Building, (The Issac W. Jones Building), is also planning to have some new small shops coming soon. He reminded people, the Facade Grants are still available to businesses. Also addressed a concern about the Rite-Aid sidewalk. Someone should check to see if the grassy area be eliminated and a full sidewalk put in. It would be much safer for residents on motorized scooters and such. Councilman Kulak agreed and said the City should inquire about this. Mr. Necciai passed out the Calliopica Newsletter and a Flyer from the Monongahela Library. Anyone under the age of 18 is encouraged to go to the Library for Free Food & Fun, from 12:30 TO 1:30, Monday thru Friday, until August 10, 2018. Senator Bartolotta Will be visiting Thursday, July 12, 2018.

Randy Giovannucci, 623 Ann Street, spoke also about flooding concerns, by His property, due to a problem with a pipe that has washed out at the bottom of Ann Street. Mr. Giovannucci wanted to be notified when work will begin, so he will have access to his property. He said he keeps the Sanitary Line on the opposite side of his house cleaned out. He was told by Council that a large tree, which was a problem, had been removed and the City has the pipe available to begin making repairs.
